

ST PETER & ST PAUL CE PRIMARY SCHOOL BURGH-LE-MARSH PE/SPORTS FUNDING IMPACT REVIEW 2015 - 2016



Purpose

To review the PE/Sports Funding spending plan for 2015/ 2016 for the Governing Body & School Community (Website).

Background

The school received in total the sum of £6,908 in two instalments in Primary Sports Funding allocation which is below the line and does not form part of the budget return. Funding is based on current entitlement per pupil funding. We were underspent in 2014/15 by £2,377 therefore the available budget was: £9,285
