










 in summer. They do not eat vegetables because it is too cold to grow even in summer. 

 What do they travel around in? 

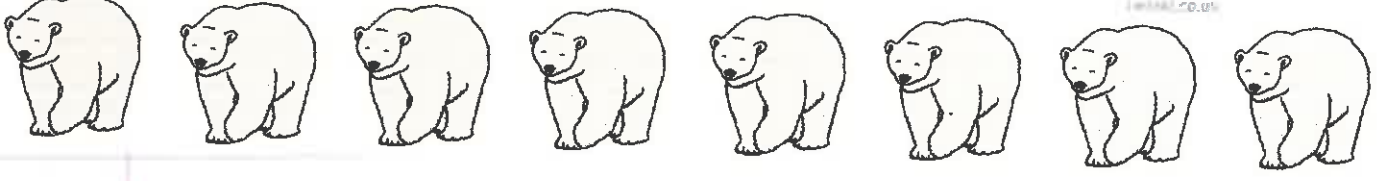
 Inuits travel by kayak with one paddle, that is thin in the middle and thick at either end. In our language we would call it a canoe. They could also travel around in a dog sled with twelve or less, but mainly it depends on how big your sled is. Also by snowmobile, or a umiag, which is a larger boat than a kayak. 



 What do they hunt? 



 Inuits hunt seal, walrus, whale, musk ox, arctic wolf, arctic fox, arctic hare. Some of the animals are harder to catch than others because they maybe are very well camouflaged or they are quite gisty. Some animals are just hunted down for there fur or skin for clothing wear. 



 What do they live in? 



 Inuits live in sod houses for winter which are 



 made out of wet mud and a little bit of grass all stuck together to make a mini house. The roof to a sod house will be made out of antler and wood. When Inuits are hunting in summer they make caribou tents because they get too warm in sod houses. Also when hunting they make igloos, by getting big blocks of snow and pile it up.

 They play the drums, drum dancing, throat singing and most importantly story telling which is about myths and creatures.
